**Exhibition at Marks Garage  
entices viewer with a bit of  
levity in humorless times**

The title of the latest exhibition at The Arts at Marks Garage poses the question in a single word: "Toy?"

As usual with art, the answer is up to viewers. Is it art, or is it a toy? Or is it a little of both? A toy by definition is a plaything for a child. The 13 island artists who created the exhibit have that in mind but the results aren't necessarily only for children.

"Playthings, diversions and curious conceptions" is how the artists describe their own work. Some are masterfully crafted sculptures that are also pull toys (by Jason Teraoka) while others are cuddly sock monkeys (by Tae Kitakata.)

"It is serious play, in a gallery setting," says Rich Richardson, Marks Garage's assistant director who says the show is about art that doubles as "alterna-toys" that stretch the definition of amusement and trinkets.

"The question is 'how much happiness can you tolerate?' I encourage everyone to get in touch with their inner fool, the jester's humor and absurdist bent. Come on down," he urges. A little humor and fun is just what we all might be needing now.
